

Middletown Arts Center suspension of classes,
events and public access through April 23, 2020

For the safety of our students, instructors and staff, the Middletown Arts Center Board of Governors has decided to suspend classes, events and public access to the Middletown Arts Center until at least the end of the current term on April 23. This action conforms with the March 12 announcement by Governor DeWine prohibiting public gatherings of more than 100 persons. As a civic organization we have a civic responsibility to act in harmony with public policy and to support efforts by public health officials to limit the impact of COVID-19.

The staff will continue to work on a number of important tasks related to future events, class schedules, building maintenance, grant writing and fund raising. They will respond to phone calls and emails during restricted business hours: Monday to Thursday from 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM. Please do not come to the Arts Center; it is closed to the public. Funding at the MAC is always a challenge.
